We have sent state-ofthe-art medical equipment to help in the battle against the coronavirus and we have also covered many of the hospital's other needs. I would like to remind all of you that the Pan Arcadian Hospital of Tripolis was built 71 years ago through the efforts of the Pan Arcadian family following a hugely successful fundraiser initiated by the P.F.A. and the Greek War Relief Fund.

PFA On-line Event Honors Bicentennial

NEW YORK-The PFA organized a commemorative online event focusing on the Peloponnese's leading role in the Greek Revolution of 1821 and the contribution of American Philhellenes to Greece's Struggle for Independence on Saturday March 27, 2021 to honor the 200th anniversary of the Greek National Rebirth.

This event, which captured the interest of a large audience from all across the United States, Greece, and other parts of the world, was co-sponsored by the Greek Education Department of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, EMBCA, the Hellenic Cultural Center of the Southwest, and the Hellenic Congress of America.

Speaking from Chicago, PFA President Andreas Papantoniou spoke about the importance of the anniversary in his opening greeting and emphasized that the battle cry "Freedom or Death" was not one of desperation, but a way of life and a decision that reflected a conscious decision of the people.

In a pre-recorded message, Archbishop Elpidophoros of America noted that this occasion will continue to serve as a reference point for our decisions whenever necessary, and spoke about the Church's "united sacrificial participation" in the struggle for freedom.

Speaking from Athens, Deputy Foreign Minister responsible for issues of Hellenism Abroad Dr. Konstantinos Vlasis, who hails from Arcadia, pointed out that 1821 represents a seminal milestone in the indivisible continuation of the Greek Nation.



The President of the "Geros tou Moria" Society Evangelia Lampropoulou-Sarafoglou highlighted the contribution made by the Greeks of the Diaspora to the preparation and support of the Revolution, while the 3rd Vice-President of the PFA Evange-






lia Sourounis spoke about how the younger generations of Greek-Americans view this national holiday.

Dr. Manos Papadakis of the University of Houston spoke about the secret society Philiki Etaireia, which helped organize the revolution, while Dr. Anastasia Giannakidou of Katerini, Greece gave a presentation on Greek folk songs.

Another Arcadian, Demetrios Logothetis, co-chair of the National Committee for the Bicentennial of the Greek Revolution, and Hellenic Congress of America President Nicholas Apostolopoulos of Charlotte, NC both offered greetings.

Duringher 15-minute speech, Maria Efthimiou, Professor of History at the University of Athens, noted that "the Peloponnese was the flagship of the Revolution," while emphasizing the important role it played during both the preparations ahead of the Revolution, as well as after its commencement. According to her, the region "was politically and ideologically prepared by the Philiki Etaireia, possessed the ability to collaborate, was home to Mani, which was already prepared for war, and received support from veteran klephts."

She also pointed out that the Peloponnese played a key role in not only the military events, but also the political developments associated with the Revolution, considering that all three National Assemblies convened during the Revolution were held there (in Epidavros, Astros in Kynouria, and Troizena), while all the cities that served as capitals during the Revolution were also located in the Peloponnese (Corinth, Argos, Nafplion, and Kranidi and Tripoli during the civil war).

Prof. Alexander Kitroeff of Haverford University spoke about the American Philhellene movement prior to, during, and immediately following the Greek Revolution, as well as the legacy that it left behind, which, according to him, shaped American history and contributed to the abolition of slavery in the southern states of the Confederacy.

This event was moderated by past PFA President and journalist Demetris Filios from the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America's Hellenic Cultural Center in Astoria, while the Archdiocese's Greek Education Director Dr. Anastasios Koularmanis was also on hand, alongside Mr. Filios. Dr. Koularmanis reiterated the need to support local parish communities and Greek Schools so that they may continue to impart the Greek language, religion and faith, on behalf of which the heroes of 1821 struggled, to younger generations of Greek-Americans.

Joining the aforementioned speakers at the Hellenic Cultural Center was another Arcadian, Ilias (Lou) Katsos, who offered a wider look back at the Revolution of 1821, in which his ancestors fought. He alsomade special mention of the contribution of Philhellenes. The President of the Archdiocese's High Council for Greek Education Athena Krommyda recited an anthology of texts dedicated to Theodoros Kolokotronis, whose portrait adorned the HCC hall, together with that of Laskarina Bouboulina.


The event was enriched by commemorative music videos, including the song "Epanastasi 1821 – Zito I Eleftheria", which was composed especially for the Bicentennial by Zoe Tiganouria featuring lyrics by Tasos Theodoropoulos, and performed by yet another Arcadian, Babis Tsertos.

THEODOROS KOLOKOTRONIS' SPEECH AT PNYX (an excerpt)

My children!

In this place, where I stand today, there once stood in the days of old, wise men who addressed the people; men with whom I am not worthy to be compared nor ascend to the heights to which they climbed. My children, I wished to see you here surrounded by the great glory of our forefathers, and I have come to tell you of all the things I personally observed during the revolution, as well as prior to and after it, and from these things to draw conclusions with you for the sake of your future happiness; although only God knows what the future holds. Your teachers and the learned men among us speak to you daily of the olden Greeks, the knowledge they possessed and the glory and honor they enjoyed among the other nations of their era, as well as their heroes, generals, and politicians. My words do not suffice. All I shall say is that they were wise, and that the other nations borrowed their wisdom and took it from this land.



PFA, Hellenic American Orgs Honor the Bicentennial


CHICAGO – The celebration for the bicentennial of the Greek War of Independence of 1821, which was held on Sunday December 12th, was a great success. The event was co-sponsored by the Panarcadian Federation of America and the Federation of Hellenic American Organizations of Illinois (Enosis), in conjunction with the Hellenic Heartbeat TV/Radio station.

ΤΟ ΝΟΗΜΑ ΤΩΝ ΔΙΑΚΟΣΑΧΡΟΝΩΝ ΤΗΣ ΕΘΝΕΓΕΡΣΙΑΣ ΤΟΥ 1821

ΥΜΠΛΗΡΩΝΟΝΤΑΙ φέτος 200 χρόνια από την έναρξη της Επανάστασης του 1821, την ανεπανάληπτη εκείνη έγερση του Ελληνικού Έθνους, με το συγκλονιστικό σύνθημα «Ελευθερία ή Θάνατος».

Σ' αυτό το σύνθημα πρωταγωνίστησε η Αρκαδία και οι Αρκάδες. Γιατί απλούστατα η Επανάσταση στην Αρκαδία δεν ξεκίνησε το 1821. Ξεκίνησε από το 1461 και την πτώση της Καρύταινας, της τελευταίας βυζαντινής πόλης που έπεσε στα χέρια των Τούρκων, οχτώ ολόκληρα χρόνια μετά την Άλωση της Κωνσταντινούπολης το 1453. Οι Αρκάδες δεν αναγνωρίσαμε ποτέ τους Τούρκους και ήταν αμέτρητα τα επαναστατικά κινήματα στην περιοχή. Ο ίδιος ο Κολοκοτρώνης περιγράφει το ανυπότακτο της οικογένειας του σε ολόκληρη τη διάρκεια της Τουρκοκρατίας λέγοντας «ώστε από όταν εφάνησαν εις τα μέρη μας Τούρκοι, ποτέ δεν τους ανεγνώρισαν, αλλ' ήσαν εις αιώνιον πόλεμον».

Με αυτό το ανυπότακτο πνεύμα έδωσε η Αρκαδία τον υπέρτατο αγώνα για την ελευθερία το 1821. Μια ελευθερία που δε μας χαρίστηκε από κανέναν, αλλά κατακτήθηκε με ανυπολόγιστες θυσίες και απαράμιλλο σθένος. Ο Κολοκοτρώνης το περιέγραψε ξεκάθαρα στον Ιμπραήμ «Πέτρα απάνω στην πέτρα να μη μείνει, εμείς δεν προσκυνούμε»!

Αυτόν το μεγαλειώδη αγώνα των προγόνων μας του 1821 έχουμε καθήκον να αναδείξουμε και να τιμήσουμε σε αυτή τη σημαντική επέτειο των διακοσάχρονων. Για να την αναδείξουμε όμως σωστά, εκτός από τις επετειακές εκδηλώσεις που θα γίνουν, πρέπει να κατανοήσουμε το σύνθημα του 1821 «Ελευθερία ή Θάνατος».

Στην ελληνική γλώσσα, σε αντίθεση με όλες τις άλλες γλώσσες στον κόσμο, η λέξη «Ελευθερία» δεν έχει μόνο την έννοια της δυνατότητας του ανθρώπου να δρα κατά βούληση, αλλά ετυμολογείται από το αρχαίο ρήμα «ελεύσομαι» που σημαίνει «θα ερθω». Ύπ' αυτήν την έννοια η «Ελευθερία» είναι αυτή που διαρκώς έρχεται και ποτέ ουσιαστικά δεν καταφτάνει. Δηλαδή είναι κάτι που απαιτεί διαρκή προσπάθεια, αγώνα, θυσίες για να το κατακτήσεις αλλά και για να το διατηρήσεις. Γιατί για τους Ελληνες, η ελευθερία δεν είναι κάτι το στατικό, αλλά κάτι το οποίο διαρκώς κινείται προς τα εμπρός και απαιτεί προσπάθεια για να το επιτύχουμε.

Έτσι πορευτήκαμε ως Έθνος 200 χρόνια τώρα, έτσι μεγαλώσαμε και πλατύναμε τη χώρα μας. Και το κάναμε απότ η σωστή πλευρά της ιστορίας, γιατί ως Έθνος σταθήκαμε πάντοτε με την πλευρά του δικαίου. Αυτό εννοούσε ο Παλαμάς όταν είπε «Η μεγαλοσύνη των Εθνών δεν μετριέται με το στρέμμα. Με της καρδιάς το πύρωμα

μετριέται και με το αίμα». Τη μεγαλοσύνη του Ελληνικού Έθνους την περιέγραψε ο Κολοκοτρώνης που είπε «Οι Έλληνες βαφτιζόμαστε μια φορά με το λάδι και άλλη μια φορά με το αίμα αν χρειαστεί για την ελευθερία της Πατρίδας»!

Το Ελληνικό Έθνος δεν διεκδικεί ούτε τον τίτλο του ισχυρότερου, ούτε του πλουσιότερου. Γιατί απλούστατα, ολόκληρη η οικουμένη μας αναγνωρίζει ως τον ευγενικότερο όλων. Είμαστε το Έθνος που γέννησε τον πιο φωτεινό πολιτισμό που γνώρισε ποτέ η ανθρωπότητα. Έναν πολιτισμό που είχε πάντοτε τον άνθρωπο στο επίκεντρό του, τις αξίες του αλλά και τα ανώτερα ιδανικά. Έναν πολιτισμό που διαπνέεται από ατόφια ελευθερία. Γιατί οι αξίες του ανθρωποκεντρικού Ελληνισμού απαιτούν διαρκή προσπάθεια, αγώνα και θυσίες για να τις κατακτήσεις αλλά και για να τις διατηρήσεις. Πάντα έτσι ήταν και πάντα έτσι θα'ναι. Μας το υπενθυμίζουν οι σφαγές που έκανε ο Ιμπραήμ στην Αρκαδία και στο Μοριά κατά τη διάρκεια της Επανάστασης.

Ας ξαναδώσουμε λοιπόν στην ανθρωπότητα το μήνυμα του 1821, την ελευθερία του ανθρώπου, αυτή που διαρκώς έρχεται. Και για να το κάνουμε αυτό, θα πρέπει να αναβαθμίσουμε την επωνυμία της χώρας μας (rebranding) αλλά και να την επανατοποθετήσουμε (repositioning) στο σύγχρονο κόσμο.

Η Ελληνική Διασπορά είναι παραπάνω από πολύτιμη σε αυτή τη νέα μεγάλη εθνική προσπάθεια. Η Αρκαδική ομογένεια στις ΗΠΑ πρέπει να είναι πρωταγωνίστρια σε αυτή την μεγάλη πρόκληση για το μέλλον. Στην εποχή της παγκοσμιοποίησης, ας απαντήσουμε ως Έθνος με την οικουμενικότητα του Ελληνισμού.

Γιατί αν ξέρεις ποιός είσαι και από πού έρχεσαι, τότε ξέρεις που μπορείς να πας και ποιος μπορείς να γίνεις. Με πίστη, με δύναμη, με αγάπη, με πάθος και με ελπίδα.

Χρόνια Πολλά, Χρόνια Δοξασμένα, Χρόνια Υπερήφανα, Χρόνια Ελληνικά, Χρόνια Ελεύθερα!

1821-2021 ΔΙΑΚΟΣΙΑ ΧΡΟΝΙΑ ΑΠΟ ΤΗΝ ΕΛΛΗΝΙΚΗ ΕΠΑΝΑΣΤΑΣΗ

το ηρωικό Βαλτέτσι, στον τόπο όπου οι Έλληνες πέτυχαν την πρώτη μεγάλη νίκη τους και μια από τις σημαντικότερες για την πορεία και εξέλιξη της Ελληνικής Επανάστασης έχει ανεγερθεί ανδριάντας του Γέρου του Μοριά. Γιατί αυτός

των Πέτρου Σαραντάκη, Συγγραφέα, & Γιώργου Κ. Σουρούνη, Πρόεδρου Συλλόγου

ήταν ο πρωταγωνιστής στη μάχη που διεξήχθη στα βουνά του Βαλτετσίου, στις 12&13 Μαΐου του 1821, απέναντι στο πολυάριθμο τακτικό στράτευμα του Κεχαγιάμπεη. Για εκείνες τις ημέρες η λαϊκή μούσα ερωτά, προτείνει αλλά και ιστορεί:

"Τι έχεις, καημένε κόρακα, που σκούζεις και φωνάζεις;

Μήπως διψάς για αίματα, για τούρκικα κεφάλια;

Πέρασε από τα Τρίκορφα και σύρε στο Βαλτέτσι,

όπου είν' ο τόπος δυνατός και δυνατά ταμπούρια...

Ο ορειχάλκινος ανδριάντας ανεγέρθηκε το 1996 και αποτελεί προσφορά των Βαλτετσιωτών της Αμερικής και της Ελλάδας. Έχει τοποθετηθεί ανατολικά και σε κοντινή απόσταση από την εκκλησία της Κοίμησης της Θεοτόκου, η οποία ανοικοδομήθηκε με την προσωπική επιστασία του Θεόδωρου Κολοκοτρώνη, μετά την Απελευθέρωση. Γιατί, ο ίδιος, απέδιδε την νίκη εκείνων των ημερών στην βοήθεια της Παναγίας, της ασπροντυμένης γυναίκας που τους καθοδηγούσε στη μάχη.

Τον ανδριάντα φιλοτέχνησε ο Ηπειρώτης γλύπτης Κώστας Καζάκος, ο οποίος παρουσιάζει τον πρωτεργάτη της ελευθερίας να φορά φουστανέλα, περίτεχνα διακοσμημένο γιλέκο και σελάχι (στη δεξιά πλευρά του είναι κρεμασμένη η θήκη με τα φυσίγγια, η παλάσκα), μπότες και στο κεφάλι του να

News and Activities for the PFA Administration

VISIT TO GREECE

A delegation of PFA Board members comprised of President Andreas Papantoniou, Board of Trustees Chairman George K. Sourounis, Treasurer John Vemis, and Director of the Midwest District Ted Stamison visited Arcadia, Greece last August.

During their stay in Arcadia, the PFA delegation held a series of meetings and collaborated with former Alternate Health Minister Vasilis Kontozamanis, former Deputy Foreign Minister responsible for matters of Hellenism Abroad Kostas Vlasis, Regional Governor of the Peloponnese Panagiotis Nikas, Lieutenant Regional Governor of Arcadia Christos Lambropoulos, Mayor of Tripolis Konstantinos Tzoumis, Hospital Director Anastasios Tzanis, University of the Peloponnese Rector Athanasios Katsis, PFA legal advisor Nikos Delfakis, and the PFA's spokesperson in Greece Demosthenes Sotiropoulos.

These meetings focused on various issues of interest to the PFA, with a special focus on the Pan Arcadian Hospital. Additionally, thedelegationhadtheopportunitytobebriefed on issues regarding development and other various projects taking place in Arcadia and the region of the Peloponnese in general.

The Mayor of Tripolis briefed the delegation on a series of projects being implemented in Tripolis, as well as the municipality in general, including the construction of the outdoor shopping center in Tripolis. The delegation also had an opportunity to implement all the necessary actions to resolve a series of issues relating to the Hospital, some of which date back years, including:

- Renewal of the contract between the PFA and the Hospital
- Delineation of the boundaries of the land parcel located behind the housing complex that was granted to the PFA with the National Land Registry
- Clearing out the areas occupied by the 6th Decentralized Administration
- Construction/financing by the PFA of the restaurant/snack bar located in the Pan Arcadian Hospital of Tripolis
- Development and concurrent upgrading of the Pan Arcadian Hospital to university hospital status

During the delegation's stay in the homeland, PFA President Andreas Papantoniou and Board of Trustees Chairman George Sourounis hosted a reception in honor of the Deputy Governor of Arcadia Christos Lambropoulos, the Mayor of Tripolis Konstantinos Tzoumis, the Dean of the University of Peloponnese Dr. Athanasios Katsis and other officials.

OTHER NEWS

The PFA Administration unanimously approved the following resolutions at a joint meeting of the Board of Directors and Board of Trustees held on August 28, 2021:

- The postponement of the National Convention scheduled for October 15-17 in Chicago. The postponement was deemed necessary due to the continuation of the COVID-19 pandemic to safeguard the best interests of everyone's health. The postponed 75th National Convention will be held in June 2022, as per the Administration's decision.
- 2. To stand in solidarity with the fire-stricken people of Arcadia, who were impacted by the recent wildfires. To facilitate this, the Administration sent a letter to the Mayor of Gortynia Eustathios Koulis and the Mayor of Megalopolis Athanasios Christos Giannopoulos informing them of the PFA's intent to assist and requesting a report on the state of the fire-stricken victims so as to prioritize those requiring the greatest aid.
- 3. The construction of a cantina (restaurant/café) at the Pan Arcadian Hospital of Tripolis by the PFA.



Creation of a Canteen-Restaurant by the P.F.A. at the Pan Arcadian Hospital in Tripolis

As most of you are aware, this issue has been preoccupying the Federation for over 20 years. The fact that it has not materialized until today is due to various obstacles, and primarily the frequent changes in Hospital Administrators, as well as Health Ministers by successive governments.

Today, the circumstances regarding the issue of the canteen are different and novel; there is an air ofpositivity coming from all interested parties, and it is on the pathway to materialization. Throughout thistime, thanks to coordinated efforts from the Administration, we have overcome various minor problems, and most importantly, we have secured the necessary approval of the Hospital's Board, as well as the leadership of the Health Ministry. At the same time, a private agreement has been signed between the P.F.A. Administration and the Hospital on 12/1/2022.

It is up to all of us, especially the upcoming convention which must approve this project to capitalize upon this opportunity, not to let it go to waste, and finally see a longtime dream become a reality. Through the operation of the canteen and the rent that the P.F.A .will collect, we will have the opportunity to cover the necessary needs of the Pan Arcadian Hospital also the requirements of the nursing school at the University of Peloponnesus in Tripolis and scholarships.

CONSTRUCTIONEXPENSES: The total cost will amount to \$300,000.00

CANTEEN AREA: The total area of the room will be 115 m2 - 1,130 sq. feet, and will include a dining area, kitchen, product display, prep area, and lavatories. There will be a veranda with an area of 65 m2 - 700 sq. feet that will also be used for dining, along with a storage area with an area of 38 m2 - 410 sq. feet.

FINANCIAL - PROJECT INVESTMENT The financing of the project as well as the operation of the canteen will be done under the responsibility of P.F.A.
